Doosan Forklift Parts - Doosan Infracore Company Ltd. is an intercontinental company consisting of Diesel Engines, Defense Industry products, Industrial Vehicles, Construction Technologies and Machine Instruments and Automation Systems.

In the United States, Doosan Infracore America Corporation is headquartered in Suwanee, Georgia. It is home to a 170,000 square foot production facility, which is the home of the Compact Equipment and Construction department. West Caldwell, New Jersey is home to the Machine Tool division and Cleveland, Ohio is home to the Lift truck division. The U.S. headquarters in Georgia facilitates a first rate parts operation capable of supplying an excess of 25,000 line items to support Lift Truck, Compact Equipment, Machine Tool and Construction customer wishes.

There are well over 220 Doosan service and product sales locations operating in Canada and the United States. Additionally, there are more than 90 independent dealers moving forklift supplies and materials handling equipment. This network helps Doosan Infracore America to aggressively compete in this competitive market. The forklift product line remarkably includes 63 different machines consisting of 82 various battery and engine configurations of Electric-powered and Internal Combustion forklifts. Capacities of these various truck models range from 3,000 to 33,000 lbs. All trucks are designed in an ISO 9001 qualified facility.

Doosan Infracore America is the fastest emerging forklift and lift truck corporation in the North American market, due to its exceptional level of product performance and their persistently high level of buyer support and service given to all Doosan Infracore Lift Truck clients. The U.S. forklift division situated in Cleveland has a skilled team experienced in Sales, Purchasing, Advertising, Logistical and Technical Support.

Originally the domestic lift truck marketplace in Korea was an open import enterprise. Korea Machinery Co. Ltd. started in 1960, to import fully assembled lift trucks as part of a domestic equipment expansion venture. Product sales of these products were initially targeted to state-run corporations, large scale organizations, and the military. This ultimately led to a merger with Daewoo Heavy Industries Ltd. In 1976, the Forklift Division begun business operations throughout Korea to service and sell this heavy equipment. By 1978, a forklift production plant was successfully completed. Continuous technical education became the new focus for improving quality and product development.

Home-based lift truck trade for Daewoo started in 1967 and grew to an astonishing 90% market share in Korea. By the 1980's, Daewoo's advanced technological enhancements combined with sales success placed them in a situation of considerable expansion of their forklift operations.

Caterpillar Industrial Inc. of the U.S. in 1981, proposed a joint venture project to help them in the very competitive North American materials handling market. This project proved highly profitable for Daewoo and their lift truck product sales expanded greatly. In 1984, the company completed construction of a new facility to help in producing high end value-added goods for export. In 1993, the company had a global sales system and started exporting models they had developed through in-house expertise, as an sovereign brand. Certifications were then acquired from CE of Europe, UL of the United States and ISO 14001 and ISO 9001, securing expansion possibilities into overseas marketplaces.
